Ibuprofen Improves Bone Repair After Surgery or a Fracture, Study Suggests

ScienceDaily (July 3, 2012) — A study conducted at Ads by Google the University of Granada has demonstrated that ibuprofen -a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID)- has beneficial effects on bone repair after a fracture or following bone surgery. In vitro tests demonstrated that -unlike other NSAIDs- when a therapeutic dose of ibuprofen is administered, it has no negative effects on the proliferation and synthesis of obsteoblast osteocalcin, a cell which is directly involved in the formation and regeneration of bones.Osteoblast cells are bone cells that synthesize the bone matrix. Consequently, osteoblasts play a major role in bone development, growth, maintenance and repair.

that "up to date, we had little information on the effects of ibuprofen on osteoblast cells." The University of Granada study demonstrates that a therapeutic dose of ibuprofen (5-25 μ m.) does not inhibit the proliferation and synthesis of osteocalcin in the MG-63 cell line. However, when higher doses are administered (>25 µm.) they may activate other cells, which might explain the expression of membrane markers and the decrease in the phagocytic
