## Conference Sessions

### **Sport and exercise in the social sciences**

The section deals with the area of sport, which is understood as encompassing high-performance sport as well as various movement activities. Social science perspectives represented include the disciplines of psychology, sociology, pedagogy, philosophy and history.

### **Physical Education in the social sciences**

The section is topically oriented on the wide spectrum of problems relating to the education area "Human beings and Health". Our attention is paid to physical education and health education in historical, philosophical, particularly didactical and curricular connection.

### **Exercise physiology, nutrition and genomics**

This section is related to physiological adaptations affecting sport performance either from the perspective of sport training or nutritional support.

### **Kinesiology, biomechanics**

The section deals with the whole area of physiotherapy and biomechanics, in sport as well as in clinical practice. The section allows space for research papers and papers referring to practical experience and also education of these specialists.

### **Sport training**

Papers from this section should be focused on three main thematic areas: a) up to date trends in elite sport training, b) research in sport training, c) university coaching education and sport training as a university study subject.

### **Children and sports training**

This section focuses on children's sport training in the field of kids development and maturity, long-term athlete development, skills and ability development, and sports talent identification.

### **Adapted physical activity**

The APA section deals mainly with the area of promoting physical activity for health and sport (at the competitive and recreational level) in people with special needs.

### **Economics, management and marketing of sport**

The section is open to contributions from the domains of legislation, economics, management, and the marketing of sport.

### **Physical Training in the Army**

The section focuses on the areas of military training, physical readiness, tests of physical condition, preparation of soldiers for extreme situations and operations in missions abroad, and on sport in the Army in general.
